Cynthia Y. Also during her second year, Ms. Sun served as a judicial extern for the U.S. District Court for the District of Connecticut where she drafted a judicial opinion on subject matter and personal jurisdiction in a patent case. In 2004, Ms. Sun served as a judicial extern for the Los Angeles County Superior Court.

After law school, Ms. Sun returned to Los Angeles to pursue her legal career. Ms. Sun has represented a variety of clients from individuals and small businesses to Fortune 500 companies. She has drafted several motions for summary judgment that have been granted or lead to settlement in her clients' favor.
